

- 1. The stegosaurus could be up to 21 ft long (9 meters) and up to 14 ft tall (4 meters)
- 2. It is commonly known to have a really REALLY tiny brain compared to its large size. Its brain was about the size of a table tennis ball.
- 3. Stegosaurus could weigh up to 5 tons, which is about 9000 lbs or 5000 Kg!
- 4. The Stegosaurus was a member of the thyreophoran, or armored dinosaur, group. Stegosaurus was the biggest of this family.
- 5. The Stegosaurus had 17-22 Bony plates, called scutes, on its back and these could be up to 2 ft tall.
- 6. The spikes on a stegosaurus tail, like the plates on its back, could be 2-3ft, (60-90cm) long

- 7. Scientists are not sure what the plates were for, but they could have been used for display, protection or to control their temperature
- 8. Stegosaurus fossils have been found mainly in the USA. However, some have also been found in Portugal as well.
- 9. The Stegosaurus was an herbivore and it fed on plants with its small teeth and beak-like mouth.
- 10. The stegosaurus was a <u>Late</u> <u>Jurassic</u> Dinosaur living around 155-145 million years ago11. Stegosaurus was first

- 18. The stegosaurus was made the state dinosaur of Colorado, which is suitable as it was where it was first discovered!
- 19. Both Stegosaurus and Ankylosaurs are thought to have evolved from older armored dinosaurs like Scelidosaurs.
- 20. it is likely that stegosaurs did lay eggs, However unfortunately no eggs, yet, have been found that are from a stegosaurus
