

# 20 Cool Facts you never knew about The Pachycephalosaurus



1. It was 14ft long and would have weighed upto 990 lbs. (450 kg)
- 2 Pachycephalosaurus head could be 9-10 inches thick and made of bone.
- 3 Pachycephalosaurus was a herbivore dinosaur which means it ate plants bushes and grasses.
4. or.... Maybe it ate meat and plants as recent discoveries have shown it had sharp teeth in the front of its mouth.
5. Pachycephalosaurus were alive between 70 and 66 million years ago during the late cretaceous
6. Pachycephalosaurus name means "thick headed lizard" and the name comes from Greek
7. Pachycephalosaurus lived with Triceratops, Quetzalcoatlus, Tyrannosaurus Rex, Ankylosaurus and Struthiomimus

8. Pachycephalosaurus could grow up to 14ft long when fully grown,
9. Pachycephalosaurus was alive at the same time as t-rex. At 15ft long it would have made a relatively easy meal
10. When the 10-inch thick Pachycephalosaurus skulls were found it was thought that there were not hard heads at all, but kneecaps of larger dinosaurs!
11. Micropachycephalosaurus. A smaller cousin, had 9 syllables and 23 letters!! Making it the longest dinosaur name
12. Pachycephalosaurus is very likely to have reproduced by laying eggs.
13. It wasn't until 1943 that pachycephalosaurus was named though.
14. Studies do suggest that those 10-inch dome heads were not just for show but could pack a punch as well and were used to fight with each other.

15. It would have gone extinct around the same time as the rest of the dinosaurs.
16. There have been many fossils of pachycephalosaurus fossils found in North America and Canada.
17. Barnum Brown and Erich Maren Schlaikjer, gave it the name Pachycephalosaurus.
18. It did have small teeth It was beaked like triceratops and had back teeth suited to strip leaves. however, in recent years sharp front teeth have been discovered,
19. Dracorex and Stygimoloch may have been young versions of pachycephalosaurus.
- 20 . Pachycephalosaurus is just TOOOO long to do that. it has 7 syllables and is one of the longest dinosaur names. You say it like this. Patch – ee – Seff – ah – low – Sore – Rus
