

# 19 Cool Facts about The Nasutoceratops



1. Nasutoceratops was a medium sized ceratopsian dinosaur (the ones with the horns and frills!) and it is estimated to be able to grow to about 15 ft long (4.5 metres)
2. The Nasutoceratops was lighter than most other horned dinosaurs and would grow to be between 3-4000 lbs in weight, or about 1.5 tons (1500 kg)
3. To the shoulder a large Nasutoceratops would be about 6ft tall, about the same size as a large cow,
4. The head of Nasutoceratops was large and could be 1.5 metres long ( 5ft)
5. Nasutoceratops was a herbivore like the other horned dinosaurs,
6. Its name means "big nose horn face"

7. It lived during the late Cretaceous period about 75 million years ago.
8. It had two very long horns, that were more horizontal than other horned dinosaurs and have been compared to cattle
9. It is unlikely that the Nasutoceratops was feathered, or if it had any skin coverings, they were likely sparse and scattered towards the end of its tail.
10. Nasutoceratops lived near the shores of the Western Interior seaway, where elasmosaurus was found, it would have been swampy wet and humid,
11. Centrosaurus, microceratus, chasmosaurus, sinoceratops are all similar horned dinosaurs.
12. Currently it is accepted that nasutoceratops was likely to live and move in herds. Though we are not sure how big those herds would be.

13. It is likely that nasutoceratops was nimbler and faster than its larger cousins, maybe up to 15-20 miles an hour.
14. Currently the only movies with Nasutoceratops is the upcoming Jurassic World Dominion Movie
15. The fossils of baby and juvenile horned dinosaurs have shown that their distinctive horns grew later, over time.
16. The nasutoceratops could have horns up to 3.5 feet long, so while they looked like cattle horns, they were much MUCH bigger.
17. Nasutoceratops fossils have been found in the Southern part of Utah, the first being in 2006 By Eric Lund.
18. Nasutoceratops is a not that easy a dinosaur name to pronounce it has 6 syllables and is said like this. Na – Soo – Toh – Sair – Rah – Tops
